

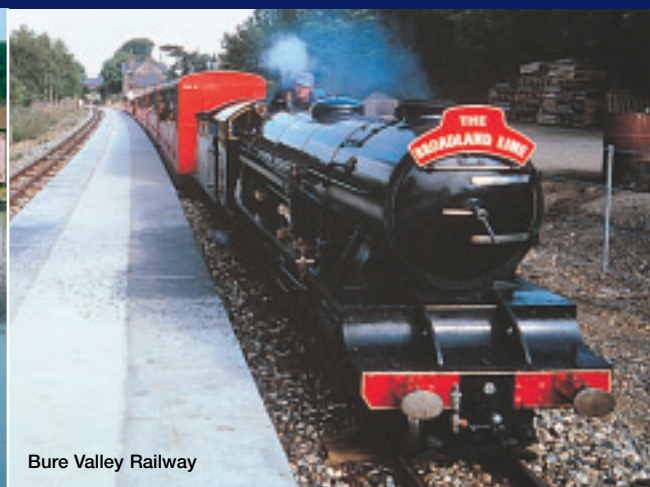
# The Upper Bure

Many say that this is the prettiest part of Broadland. It is certainly one of the most photographed areas - so make sure you bring your camera.

Wroxham is the heartbeat of the Upper Bure offering plenty in which to indulge yourself. Downstream from here are the peaceful open waters of Wroxham, Salhouse, Blackhorse and Malthouse Broads, where you can while away your time carefree. Back on the main stretch of the Bure, river traffic gets a bit busier, much of it stopping to admire picturesque Horning. Upstream from Wroxham, woodland keeps you company until Belaugh where the countryside opens up to reveal breathtaking views. It's then a pleasant meander on to lovely Coltishall.

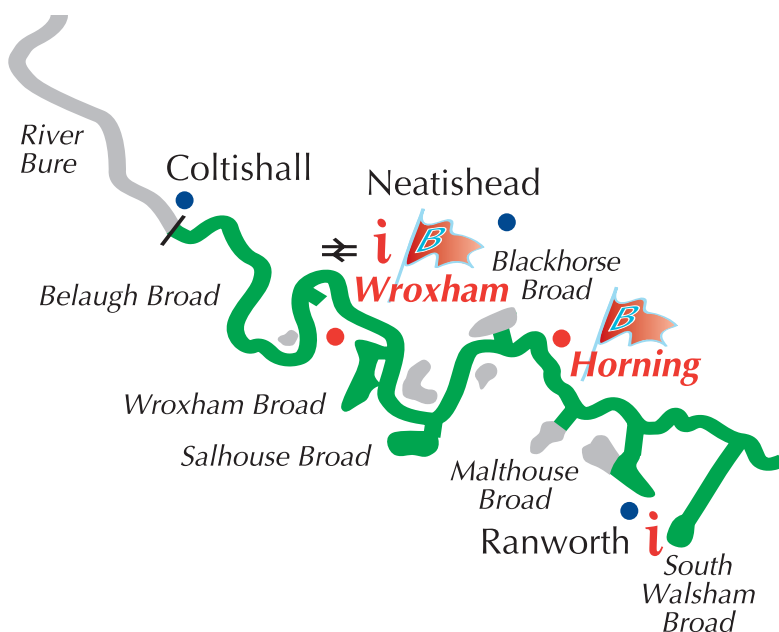


Picturesque Coltishall

## Discover the local sights...



### Coltishall

Lovely riverside green and pubs. Just upstream from here secluded moorings near Horstead Mill pool and lock.

### Ranworth

Broads Wildlife Centre on the edge of Ranworth Broad with floating exhibition building and viewing gallery. Ranworth Church – cathedral of the Broads with superb views from the tower. Broads Authority Information Centre.

### Wroxham

The heart of Broadland, facilities for all the family including “the largest village store in the world” and a McDonalds! Leisure Centre with pool at Moores “Peninsula”.

### Bure Valley Railway

An old Great Eastern line linking Wroxham and the ancient market town of Aylsham through beautiful countryside.

### Cockshoot Broad

Near Woodbastwick, a boarded walk takes you through to the clear water Broad as it was 100 years ago.

### Hoveton Great Broad Nature Trail

A half mile walk through a ‘tropical swamp’, so keep to the path!
